

## Project Info

The Sonoco Paper Mill was built in 1890 and it was operational until a fire destroyed portions of the facility in 2005.

The paper mill consisted of a 4-story boiler house, 2 smoke stacks and 300,000 SF of industrial buildings.

The heavy industrial buildings were demolished with pulverizers and shears mounted on excavators. The boiler house was dropped through a cut and pull operation, and the smoke stacks were imploded by Controlled Demolition Inc.

The implosion of the stacks was within 20 FT of Amtrak and Septa rail lines and within 25 FT of a main sewer line made of terracotta eight feet below the surface. Careful coordination and planning were required.
